The Alberta Lung Association Called!

The Alberta Lung Association needed help with their Breathe of Life Event. The Edmonton Host Lions Club answered the call.

The **Edmonton Host Lions Club** served up hot dogs and drinks at the future site of the Alberta Lung Association Breathing Space House on Friday, July 23. Once built, it will have 36 suites to house people who are in need of lung transplants. The Lung Association's Breathing Space will be the first facility of its kind in Canada. It will provide a sanctuary for lung transplant patients and their families, giving them much-needed "breathing space" in their fight to regain their strength and vitality.



Lions Care Kits Expansion

At the July Club board meeting, **Lion Janet** outlined plans to expand handing out Lions Care Kits. The two new locations that are planned are St Faith's Anglican Church on 11725 - 93 St. (https://stfaithsanglican.org/) and the **Ihuman Youth Society** at 9635 – 102 A Ave.

<u>St Faith's Anglican Church</u> mission is "to honour and uphold the dignity of each person we meet, to combat loneliness, and to build community and journey together in reconciliation and peace."

They make and serve about 100 meals each Thursday, Friday and Saturday. They also provide meals to John Humphreys Centre whose volunteers distribute meals directly to homeless and vulnerable people on the streets. In 2020, they also partnered with the Creating Hope Society who delivered meals to Indigenous elders and with the EPSB - Spruce Avenue School, Prince Charles School - to provide meals to families when children were online learning and not able to access school meals programs.

Lion Janet tells us they will let us set up a table during their meal service to hand out our kits when they resume in September. Before Covid meals were held Thurs 11-11:30, Friday 5-6:30, Sat 9-10:30. We would like a couple of club members to hand out kits maybe every second week at one of the meal times.

<u>Ihuman Youth Society</u> (https://ihuman.org/) is the second location that has been chosen. They support youth aged 12-24 navigating complex systems such as housing, transportation, mental health, justice, financial assistance and medical care. They support youth impacted by poverty, intergenerational trauma, addiction, mental health, abuse, racism, discrimination and exploitation. Over 500 youths between 12 -24 years of age access them every year, 80% of whom self-identify as indigenous. While they provide free access to service and programs, they are not a drop-in centre – youth actively engage in determining their individualized journey through their resources and they guide how they can be supported. They have been operating since 1977.

They are very willing and could use 50 - 100 Lions Care Kits a month. **Lion Janet** notes that there is no opportunity for us to distribute kits, but Ihuman staff will hand them out as people come in. All kits handed out will have the **Edmonton Host Lions Club** label on them.






Lion Benaron - The reason they call it an "empty nest" is the day after your kids leave you find 18 years worth of charging cables in a single giant wad.
