Dear Club President & Club LCIF Coordinator:

Congratulations! Your club has qualified to participate in Lions Clubs International Foundation's District and Club Community Impact grant (DCG) program. Learn more about the program at lionsclubs.org/DCG.



Based on cumulative eligible donations of US\$16,763.87 to LCIF during last Lion year, your club can now apply for a DCG of as much as US\$2,514.58 to support local humanitarian service activities. This second figure includes funds your club may have earned through previous eligible donations to LCIF. Eligible donations include those to LCIF's Empowering Service Fund and to the Area of Greatest Need. Donations to LCIF's Disaster Relief Fund, and other designated donations, do not count toward cumulative giving.

Club DCG funds achieved in a given fiscal year are available, upon approval of a DCG grant application, for as many as 15 years. If you decide to apply for a DCG this year, LCIF recommends consulting your immediate past club president during the application process.

Questions regarding donations or DCG fund balances can be directed to LCIF Donor Services at donorassistance@lionsclubs.org. Clubs choosing to transfer some of or their entire DCG balances to their districts should also email donorassistance@lionsclubs.org.

CLERC UPDATE

As many Lions Clubs are aware, CLERC has continued operations throughout the Covid pandemic. It certainly has changed the way that we do business. We have for the last 18 months literally wiped our way out the door with PPE as we leave.

Eyeglass processing has been virtually done by a skeleton crew of 7 or 8 with plenty of safe distancing space in the warehouse. Gratitude to all Lions across Canada as CLERC recently put its 6 Millionth pair of glasses on a face and have supplied vision glasses to 103 different countries.

Glasses have continued to flood in from Lions Clubs and optometrists from across Canada. What finished product has been shipped, has been put in SeaCans and then is shipped to its destination country.

In June we shipped 70,000 pairs to Ghana, Sierra Leone and the Ivory Coast. It cleaned out most of the product in CLERC's 40' storage container.

Recently 20 members of the Calgary Filipino Lions Club came in and volunteered. It was our first full group of volunteers in 18 months. Next up, Calgary Westwinds Lions are in on Saturday August 28.







CLERC will be opening the warehouse up to any clubs to come and volunteer for Eyeglass Work Parties. At this point in our Covid recovery, CLERC will provide coffee and tea, and BBQ'd burgers for lunch only. Clubs are encouraged to bring in dessert. Pop and water are available for \$1.

Operational Changes: The CLERC Executive welcomed Lion Dave Leshchyshyn and Lion Glenn Robertson to the board at our recent AGM.


At the last Board meeting the motion by **Lion**

- The location of event and date and time of the event

Note: Administrative hours also count as volunteer hours

NSVF, LVGES, LCOEF attendance at those meetings count as time volunteered and can be recorded.

stories that have circulated about EHLC members. We have put together some of our own lies, half-truths and out and out whoppers.




Lion Emiliano - I wish I could just drop my body off at the gym and go pick it up after the workout.


